Fire Solutions, a company specializing in producing tailor-made fire protection solutions to the construction industry, used their own epoxy intumescent castings to do the job successfully. Local architects—McLaren, Murdock and Hamilton—were originally appointed to come up with a look that not only reflected the style and

status of the Audi marque but also had a point of difference to underscore the technological superiority of the cars. When it came to the central columns, they knew these needed to provide 1.5 hours fire protection but didn't want the selected system to detract from the overall design effect.

Although thin-film intumescent had been deployed in the rest of the building, this was unsuitable for the columns. Secondary cladding would not have met the design criteria—and it was too late to consider concrete filling. Interact's answer was to use their very latest meshless version of cast epoxy intumescent—a superior product at a competitive price to these other alternatives.

As Jana Boulton, the project architect commented: *"We had to make absolutely sure that the requirement to have a sufficient period of fire protection in no way compromised the aesthetic appeal of the structure. The help Interact gave us meant this was never in doubt."*
